## Looking Back--Looking Forward

**First a look back:** 2009 was a challenging year in many ways. Early in the year the session faced some difficult decisions regarding a reduction of approximately \$300,000 from the church budget and the elimination of one staff position and the reduction of another to part-time. During the year many of our members faced economic challenges in their own lives. And over the course of the year we said our final farewells to eighteen of the "saints" who have blessed the life of this church in so many ways. A challenging year indeed!

And yet despite it all, because of your faithfulness and generosity, and the careful and responsible budgeting of committees in the church, we ended the year in remarkably good financial shape. We were able to pay all of our bills, to fulfill all of our benevolent intentions, and make a contribution of \$5,000 to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance for relief work in Haiti. In addition we were able to put \$20,000 in a building "capital reserve" fund. You will find a fuller financial report in this Newsletter.

Once again this congregation has stepped up to meet and overcome a significant challenge. On behalf of the Session let me thank you for your ongoing support of the ministries of this wonderful congregation.

**Now a look forward:** Because of the generous gifts of the Pellett and Wearn families to our Endowment Fund, we are able to offer each year a series of presentations by outstanding pastors and teachers.

This year in celebration of the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of John Calvin our series will be presented by the **Rev. Dr. Michael Bush** and the **Rev. Dr. Richard Burnett**, both at Erskine Theological Seminary. Their working title for the series is "The Life and Legacy of John Calvin." The series will run **from February 21 through March 28, 2010, at 10:00 a.m. each Sunday in the Graham Fellowship Hall.**

Dr. Bush is currently Vice President for Seminary Development and External

Relations at Erskine. He has also taught worship, preaching, and Presbyterian polity at Erskine. He has a Div. degree from Union Theological Seminary in Virginia, S.T.M. from Yale University Divinity School, and Ph.D. from Princeton Theological Seminary. Among his other works, Michael is the editor of a very helpful book of funeral sermons, *This Incomplete One: Words Occasioned by the Death of a Young Person* (Eerdmans Press, 2006). We have a copy in the church library.



Dr. Burnett is professor of systematic theology at Erskine. He is a graduate of King College, 1985; M.Div., Princeton Theological Seminary, 1988; S.T.M., Yale University Divinity School, 1993; Ph.D., Princeton Theological Seminary, 2001; with additional studies at the University of Tübingen, Germany. He and Michael have both served in the pastorate. Richard was an associate pastor with Dick Ray, one of our teachers last year. Michael was pastor of the Trinity Presbyterian Church in Richmond, VA.

Once again, I am very much looking forward to this series which in so many ways enriches the life of this congregation intellectually and spiritually. I encourage you to be here to learn more about the life and legacy of the one who more than any other has shaped the faith and life of the Presbyterian Church, John Calvin.

Continuing our immersion in Reformed Theology, during the season of Lent I will be leading a series of Wednesday Night Fellowship programs on "Lives of Faith: Makers of Contemporary Theology." On Feb. 24 we will watch a video on John Calvin. The following weeks I will do presentations on Karl Barth, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Reinhold Niebuhr, and Frederick Buechner.

**HAITI RELIEF:** There are many organizations doing outstanding work in raising funds for relief in Haiti. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance has already sent over \$210,000 and is working in cooperation with our ecumenical partners on the ground to provide emergency food, water, shelter and medical supplies. Please pray for those affected and give to the ongoing relief through **PDA account number DR000064**. Box 643700, Pittsburgh, PA 15264-3700. Gene Krcelic in our church is a member of the PDA national response team.

**HEIFER PROJECT:** We are again this year participating in this worthwhile project during the Lenten Season. This program enables churches to help others help themselves. In previous years, we were able to collect enough monies to purchase several animals – a heifer, two water buffalo, a pig, a llama, flock of chickens, two goats, two sheep and honeybees! Heifer Project works in 31 countries and gives not only the animal or animals, but also the training to help families become self-reliant. The children will be given banks (let us know if your child doesn't receive one) during the Lenten Season and all money will be collected on Easter Sunday. Our paper mache version of a heifer will be in the Sanctuary beginning **February 21** with her feed bucket so that our adults (who are very necessary donors to this worthwhile project!) will have a place to put their contributions! Our goal is to be able to purchase one \$500 heifer and as many other animals as we can. We appreciate everyone's help with this great project.

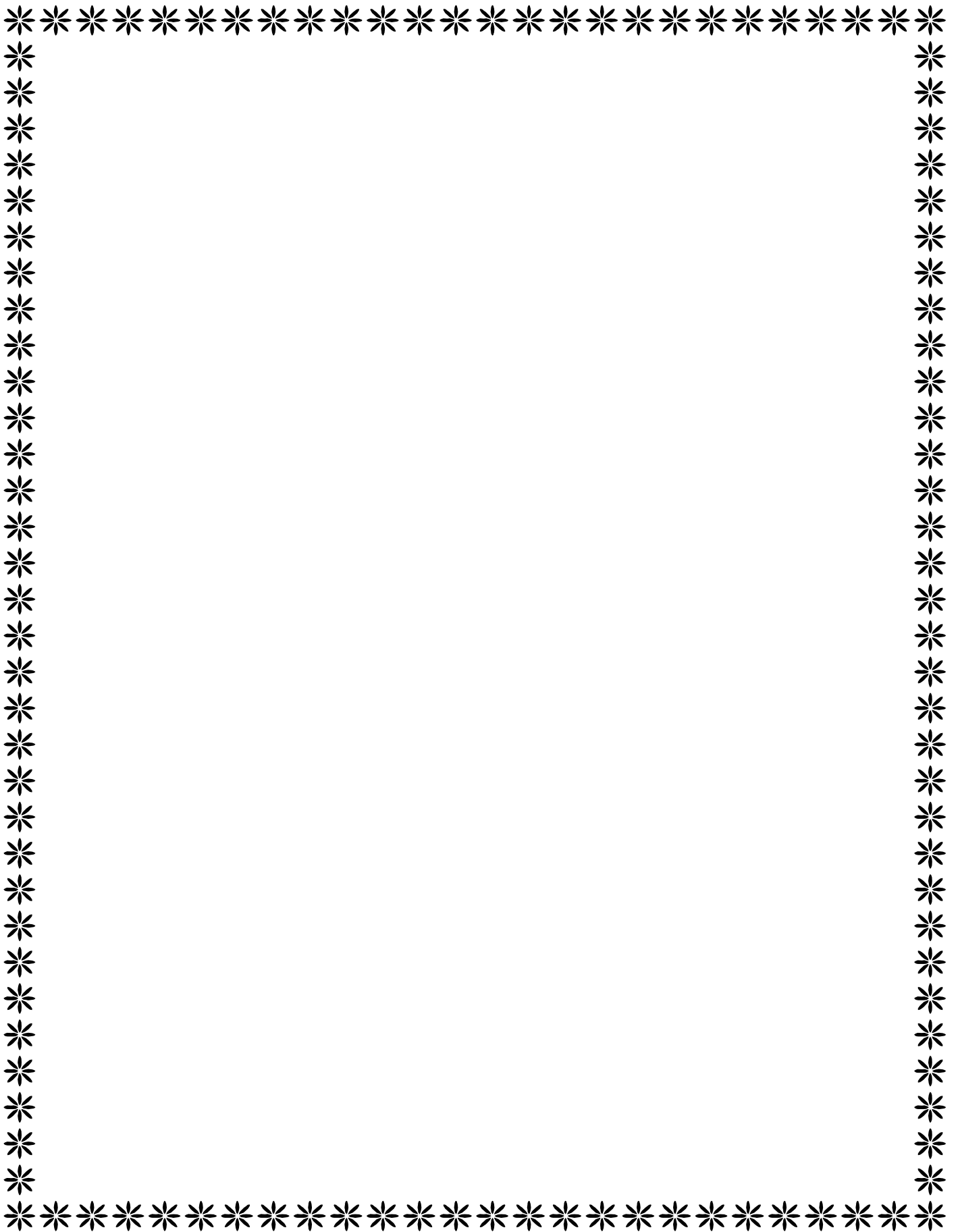

**END OF THE YEAR FINANCIAL REPORT:** In 2009 the church budget was \$1,000,000. Actual expenditures were \$982,056. Because of generous giving throughout the year and strong end-of-the-year giving, we received total contributions to Budget in 2009 of **\$1,057,255**. We were able to pay all of our benevolences. Giving to benevolences from all sources, including **\$13,233.50** from the Alternative Christmas Market, totaled **\$203,000**, approximately 20% of our budget. In addition, at its January meeting the session authorized a payment of **\$5,000** to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance for relief work in Haiti, put **\$20,000** in a much-needed building capital reserve fund, and approved the early payment of some of our benevolences for 2010. Because of this congregation's generosity in challenging times we ended 2009 strong and we begin the new year in good financial shape. Thank you for making it possible by your faithful stewardship.

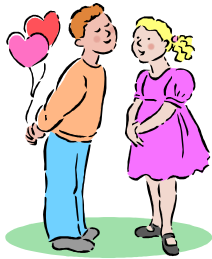

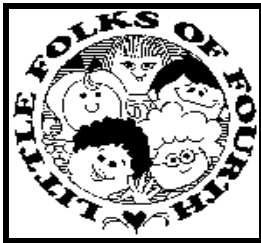
